

Speaker 4: Mark Boden

Head, Research Policy Mixes and Foresight Sector, Knowledge for Growth Unit, European Commission Joint Research Centre

Mark Boden (United Kingdom, 1963) is the Leader of the ERA Policy Mixes, Joint Programming and Foresight Action of the Knowledge for Growth Unit of the Institute for Prospective Technological Studies (IPTS), Joint Research Centre, European Commission, Seville, Spain.

He has been at IPTS since 2002, and his current activities include leading the European Foresight team, the ERAWATCH strategic intelligence service, and the NETWATCH on-line platform on transnational research collaboration. He was previously a member of the IPTS Futures Project team, working on: Foresight in Information Society Technologies in the European Research Area (FISTERA); Science and Technology Roadmapping; and the Future of Manufacturing in Europe 2015-2020 (FutMan).

Prior to joining IPTS he was a Research Fellow with Policy Research in Engineering Science and Technology (PREST) at the University of Manchester, UK. Between 1983 and 2002 he studied and worked on various aspects of science and technology policy, including: the evaluation of UK and international science and technology policies and programmes; analysis of science, technology and innovation policy; and the economics of innovation and technological change.
