

Panel 4: Big Shifts and Discontinuities

Speaker: Ian Goldin

Director, Oxford Martin School

Dr. Ian Goldin is the Director of the Oxford Martin School and Professorial Fellow at Balliol College, University of Oxford. The School undertakes interdisciplinary research, with over 300 scholars addressing key future challenges.

From 2001 to 2006, Ian was at the World Bank, first as Director of Policy and then from 2003 as Vice President with wide-ranging responsibilities. From 1995 to 2001 Dr. Goldin was Chief Executive and Managing Director of the Development Bank of Southern Africa and advisor to President Mandela. Previously, Ian worked at the European Bank for Reconstruction and Development (EBRD) in London, as Principal Economist, and at the OECD Development Centre in Paris, where he directed the Programs on Trade, Agriculture and Environment.

Ian holds a BSc and BA (Hons) degree from the University of Cape Town, a MSc from the London School of Economics and an MA and DPhil from the University of Oxford. He has been knighted (Chevalier) by France and was nominated Global Leader of Tomorrow by the World Economic Forum. He has published over fifty articles and thirteen books, including *The Economics of Sustainable Development* (Cambridge University Press) and *Globalization for Development* (Oxford University Press) and *Exceptional People* (Princeton University Press).
