Dr Michael Denison is Research Director at Control Risks, a leading international risk consultancy, where he oversees the work of approximately 50 analysts in the Global Risk Analysis team. He is responsible for the design and delivery of complex projects in emerging markets for a variety of private and public sector clients, focusing particularly on the former Soviet Union, Afghanistan and Pakistan. Michael was formerly Special Adviser to the UK Secretary of State for Foreign and Commonwealth Affairs, the Rt Hon David Miliband MP. Working within the Foreign Secretary's private office he was responsible for providing strategic policy advice and writing speeches and press articles. Prior to this appointment, he was Lecturer in International Security at the University of Leeds, Visiting Lecturer at the University of St Andrews and Associate Fellow at Chatham House. He graduated in Modern History from Oxford University where he received the Royal Historical Society Frampton Prize. Focusing on the former Soviet Union and South Asia, Michael has published extensively on energy, corruption and security issues including numerous book chapters, research papers and articles in journals such as *Europe-Asia Studies*, *OstEuropa*, *Asian Affairs*, *IISS Strategic Survey* and *The World Today*.
