Nicola Casarini is Research Fellow in the European Union Institute for Security Studies (EUISS) in Paris. Before joining the EUISS, Dr Casarini was Marie Curie Research Fellow (2008-2010) and Jean Monnet post-doctoral Fellow (2006-2007) in the Robert Schuman Centre for Advanced Studies at the European University Institute (Florence), as well as Associate Fellow for China and East Asia (2007-2010) at the Istituto Affari Internazionali (Rome). He holds a PhD in international relations from the London School of Economics and Political Science; a Diplome d'Etudes Superieures from the Graduate Institute of International Studies (Geneva); and a BA in political science from Bologna University. He has published works on EU-China and EU-East Asia relations, European foreign policy, Chinese foreign policy, East Asia's security and transatlantic relations. He is the author of: *Remaking Global Order: The Evolution of Europe-China Relations and its Implications for East Asia and the United States* (Oxford: Oxford University Press, 2009). Since 2011, Dr Casarini participates to ESPAS (European Strategy and Policy Analysis System) which is an inter-institutional system identifying long-term trends on major policy issues facing the European Union. He contributed to the first ESPAS report in 2011 assessing long-term trends in the Asia-Pacific region and producing strategic foresight for use by the EU.
